    you for coming in. I'm always taken by your baritone

I'm sure you'd be an instant 4 success anytime you open your mouth to sing. 5 MS. LEICHTER: Humor is key. 6 7 MR. BRANDON: But we'd like to thank you for 8 applying. 9 MR. TROWBRIDGE: Thank you. 10 MR. BRANDON: You've come with good 11 recommendations from your colleagues, and we'd like for 12 you to talk about your vision. We've read it. We'd 13 like to hear it from you, and any other -- and maybe a 14 little overview of your background. 15 MR. TROWBRIDGE: Sure. So, I think, for 16 those of you who aren't as familiar with the sort of 17 Chamber of Commerce role, we were very fortunate, when 18 the Trust was created, to have a permanent voting seat 19 on the Trust. 20 And so, for a number of years, that has been 21 shared with other colleagues. But my predecessor, when 22 his time was term-limited, gave an opportunity for a new 23 person to step in. 24 So I took on that role almost three years

ago. And in doing so, I think, A) sort of bring to the

table kind of the business community's perspective, but

B) just be here to help and serve, kind of what Chambers

do with our members each and every day.

So, as I think as you see on my statement, my goal is obviously to support leadership and work closely with them. I've been serving on the Finance Committee all of that time.

And I obviously, I think, have a pretty good idea of the operation. It's just a scale of difference, pretty significant, from what we do in the Chamber world, but very much about transparency and working and building coalitions.

So, that's kind of my background. I've been at our Chamber for about 12 years and I've been chairing a coalition group of about a dozen Chambers for about the last 10 or so. So, I'm really good, I think, at building consensus and convening folks and creating conversation.

MR. BRANDON: Okay. And how about -- does that encapsulate the vision as well?

MR. TROWBRIDGE: Well, I think the vision is as simply as I put it is that, you know, I think the vice chair is a role of support. And so obviously, the by-laws sort of give you a pretty narrow idea of what that person does.

1 If the chair is absent or needs to step 2. away, then it's the role for a short period of time. Ι would feel comfortable doing it. But I think in the 3 role that Ken has as the new chair, he's very eager to 4 5 keep us moving forward. So, I would support what he's doing. 6 7 You know, if I see opportunities for us to, you know, a special project or something like that, I 8 9 would certainly hope that maybe there would be an 10 opportunity to lead in that. 11 So, I guess, my goal is to be as big a team 12 player as possible and a cheerleader of what the Trust 13 is doing, and be available for whatever may be needed. 14 MR. BRANDON: Any questions from the Board 15 members, my colleagues? 16 MS. DONWORTH: I just have a general 17 question. 18 MR. BRANDON: Sure. 19 MS. DONWORTH: I know you've done a 20 phenomenal job at the City of Coral Gables and really 21 enhancing the profile, all of that. And I'm just 22 wondering, from the perspective of marketing, from 23 seeing where there are opportunities, can you see 24 additional opportunities for the Trust? 25 MR. TROWBRIDGE: Sure. I think, you know,

one of the things that was, you know, unique about the Coral Gables Chamber when I came there 12 years ago was that we spent a lot of our time focused on the business but not about the business in terms of elevating that.

So, you know, my first six months, I just spent a lot of time and energy going out meeting the folks, and not only acquainting them with what we do but really reacquainting them with what our community is about. I saw it bigger than just a membership-based organization.

So, I think, at times, we can be inward-focused because we have a very large, you know, constituency. We have a very broad, you know, spectrum of activities that we're doing.

And so with that as a volunteer or in this role as the vice chair could be to sort of help lift that, maybe that's an additional sort of assignment and opportunity.

You know, we have something very special here. And, I think, at the end of the day, when you talk to people, they still kind of scratch their heads a little bit, not so much in the sense of the brand but maybe in the sense of the drill-down of what we do each and every day.

And when you even mention small things,

like, our internship programs or the fact that, you know, when I did "Principal for a Day" and the school nurse was there, we were helping support them, not everybody knows that, including some of the folks who work at that school.

So, I think we all have to be evangelists for what the organization does. And if I can help lead that effort, work closely with Ken on that, I'd be glad to.

MR. BRANDON: Any other questions, any comments from anyone?

MR. HOFFMAN: I don't have a question. But before Mark leaves, I would like to say, since I can say it in a public context and not in a private context, first of all, I'm thrilled that you raised your hand to take this opportunity.

And I do think there are things in that nature, the nature of marketing and some of the skills that you have, that would be terrific. And I would just say that, take initiative, because nothing you do will step on my toes in that regard.

And, of course, you know, we have staff here who's more than willing to help. And I really look forward, since we're going to meet in the Executive Committee and the like but, you know, sit and plan

without this context.

So, I would welcome any opportunities that you have to increase the visibility, exposure and understanding of the public of what we're doing.

MR. TROWBRIDGE: Thank you.

MS. LEICHTER: I'd like to say that I'm also happy that you put your name in. We didn't know -- well, I didn't know that you were the candidate until we walked in today. So, you're just always so friendly and happy.

And I think that's important, especially with the turnover on the Board, you know, to have the Executive Committee and the officers be, like, have that personality to welcome people, and you're just very approachable so, thank you.

MR. TROWBRIDGE: Well, I come from a non-profit background. I've always worked in a non-profit, whether it's community-based organizations, starting out many years ago at SwitchBoard of Miami, or working for City government.

I've already worked in that arena, and I think that approachability is obviously a hallmark for leadership. And I also think it makes people who come in a room with 40 folks around the table from all different walks of life, especially in an on-boarding

process, can be really daunting. 1 2 I went through it myself. I remember my very first meeting where we were getting blasted as a 3 Board, I mean, blasted. And I was completely oblivious 4 that they were basically talking about me which, I 5 guess, is good. 6 7 But in a way, those types of things are obviously a vestige of the past. But I also think you 8 9 have to be diligent. But I think if you create that 10 type of culture and environment on the Board, that there 11 are better ways that we can handle that and support 12 staff, because they were taking it on the chin at the 13 same time. 14 As a person who is staff to a Board of 40, 15 almost the same exact size, I certainly understand the 16 kind of nuances, both behind the scenes and in front of 17 the cameras. 18 MR. BRANDON: All right. Thank you for 19 coming in. 20 MR. TROWBRIDGE: Thank you. We'll see if I 21 go back in the right door again. Thank you all very 22 much. I appreciate your time and your faith and trust. 23 (WHEREUPON, Mark Trowbridge exited the 24 meeting room.)
