2	(Recording of the meeting began at 3:02 p.m.)
3	DR. BAGNER: All right, good afternoon,
4	everyone. Long time no see. And I apologize again
5	for not being there in person. We're going to call
6	this meeting to order. And before we begin, I
7	believe we have three public comments.
8	So, Muriel, are they on?
9	MS. JEANTY: Yes, they are there.
10	DR. BAGNER: Okay, great. So our first public
11	comment is from Stratton Pollitzer from Ocoee,
12	Florida.
13	Stratton, are you there?
14	MR. POLLITZER: Yes, I'm here. Can you hear me?
15	DR. BAGNER: Yes. Go ahead.
16	MR. POLLITZER: I don't know why my camera is
17	not on. Thank you for giving me just a moment to
18	address you. My name is Stratton Pollitzer, I am the
19	cofounder and deputy director of Equality Florida,
20	which is the state's largest LBGTQ organization. I'm
21	also almost a 20-year resident of the city of North
22	Miami. And I am I wanted to just express, my own
23	and our organization's deep endorsement of Victor
24	Diaz-Herman's nomination to join the board of
25	directors.

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1	As you all know, LGBTQ youth make up a very
2	large part of our young people community here in
3	Miami. Over 19 percent of Miami-Dade students
4	identify as LGBTQ in self-reported surveys in our
5	public school system. And they face enormous risks,
6	elevated risks across a range of issues from skipping
7	school, dropping out, parental rejection, violence,
8	substance abuse, homicide and suicide. And we just
9	think it is crucial to have someone on the board with
10	pictures, deep experience and professional expertise
11	on meeting the needs of LGBTQ youth.
12	I've been working with The Children's Trust,
13	really, since you formed. I was part of a group of
14	folks who sat down with The Trust leadership 15 years
15	ago to talk about how we can better partner to reach
16	our LGBTQ young people and the alliance for LGBTQ
17	youth is what sprung from that in early meeting. And
18	I feel like this is the moment for us to take the
19	next step in that partnership and its really vital to
20	have some new expertise on the board. Beyond that, I
21	also just want to say LGBTQ issues are intersexual
22	issues, our community is every community.
23	I've worked with Victor personally for many
24	years. He leads our oldest LGBTQ youth agency in the
25	entire state of Florida, Pridelines. He's done a

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1	beautiful job there, and I know he knows how to work	
2	intersexually with lots of communities. I think he'd	
3	be a wonderful addition and I hope that you all will	
4	be choosing him today. Thank you very much.	
5	DR. BAGNER: Great. Thank you very much,	
6	Stratton.	
7	Our next public comments from Denise Palazzo,	
8	also	
9	MS. JEANTY: Mary Snow is there.	
10	DR. BAGNER: Denise is not there?	
11	MS. JEANTY: Mm-hmm.	
12	DR. BAGNER: Okay. So, Mary Snow is our third	
13	public comment from Coral Gables Community	
14	Foundation.	
15	MS. SNOW: Hi, can you hear me?	
16	DR. BAGNER: Yes, we can hear you.	
17	MS. SNOW: Hi. Thank you for having me today.	
18	As I mentioned, my name is Mary Snow, I'm the CEO of	
19	the Coral Gables Community Foundation. I'm here	
20	today in support of my longtime close personal	
21	friend, Victor Diaz-Herman, for a board membership on	
22	The Children's Trust. I just want to share that	
23	Victor is a wonderful person. I've known him since	
24	we were children. And I have the pleasure of working	
25	with him in a professional capacity as the Community	

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1	Foundation is a funder of Pride Lines, the	
2	organization that he proudly has served as CEO for 15	
3	years.	
4	Victor has a very strong personal character.	
5	He's a decent person. A very fair person. He has	
6	showed such leadership and passion for young people	
7	in our community, not only young people, LGBTQ young	
8	people, but all types of youth in our community.	
9	What he's done with Pride Lines in the 15 years that	
10	he's led the organization from a very small	
11	organization to quite the powerhouse that it is. I'm	
12	so proud of him and very happy to be here today to	
13	attest to his personal character and to support his	
14	nomination to The Children's Trust board.	
15	DR. BAGNER: Great, thank you, Mary.	
16	And do we have our other public comment, Denise	
17	Palazzo, or did she not make it on?	
18	MS. JEANTY: Dan, she did not make it yet.	
19	DR. BAGNER: Okay. Okay, with that, I will move	
20	forward with some of the business on our agenda. I	
21	know we have a quick meeting today. But first,	
22	business of approving the minutes from our previous	
23	meeting. If I can have a motion?	
24	MS. DONWORTH: So moved.	
25	MR. TROWBRIDGE: I'll second it, Daniel. Mary	

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1	made the initial motion.	
2	DR. BAGNER: Yes, thank you, Mary and Mark.	
3	All those in favor?	
4	ALL: Aye.	
5	DR. BAGNER: All those opposed?	
6	Motion passes unanimously. So with that, let's	
7	move forward with our main agenda item, which is to	
8	select a candidate of those that we interviewed this	
9	morning. So, do we have a, Juana, do we have like an	
10	Excel file that we can start keeping track?	
11	So I asked everyone to identify their top two	
12	candidates. I guess I could start, given that I'm on	
13	top of the list here. So my top two candidates are	
14	Victor Diaz-Herman and Sam Joseph. And we'll just go	
15	down the list and we'll see where we end.	
16	Gilda?	
17	MS. FERRADAZ: My two were Samuel Joseph and	
18	Orlando Gonzalez.	
19	MS. DONWORTH: My two were Victor Diaz-Herman	
20	and Samuel Joseph.	
21	DR. BAGNER: And Mark?	
22	MR. TROWBRIDGE: My top two were Victor Diaz-	
23	Herman and Heather Binns.	
24	DR. BAGNER: Okay, I think the other committee	
25	members are absent, is that correct? I know Ken is	

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1	on, Ken, would you like to weigh in?	
2	MR. HOFFMAN: It's a close one. My two were	
3	Victor Diaz-Herman and Orlando Gonzalez.	
4	DR. BAGNER: Okay, great. I would say this was	
5	a tough one. All of the candidates were extremely	
6	strong. And I know I had a tough time. But with	
7	those votes, there's a clear winner among us, Victor	
8	Diaz-Herman, who had four votes. And second, Sam	
9	Joseph. And third, Orlando Gonzalez.	
10	So with that, I would recommend that we move	
11	forward	
12	MR. HOFFMAN: Dan?	
13	DR. BAGNER: Go ahead. Yes?	
14	MR. HOFFMAN: I'd just remind, I'm happy to be	
15	influencing the vote, I'll just remind you I'm a	
16	nonvoting member of the committee	
17	DR. BAGNER: Correct.	
18	MR. HOFFMAN: according to the bylaws, so.	
19	DR. BAGNER: If we don't count your votes, that	
20	would actually leave us to Victor Diaz-Herman and Sam	
21	Joseph as tying.	
22	MS. DONWORTH: Can I ask a question? Because I	
23	gave mine in order of my preference. So my number	
24	one preference was Victor Diaz-Herman. My number two	
25	was Sam Joseph. Because I don't know that they're	

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1	necessarily equal votes. Do you get what I'm saying?	
2	DR. BAGNER: Right.	
3	MR. TROWBRIDGE: Sort of like weighted votes. I	
4	would agree with the way Mary did it. I gave my	
5	first as Victor and my second as Heather.	
6	DR. BAGNER: And I also would say my first was	
7	Victor and my second was Sam. So I think with that -	
8	-	
9	MR. HOFFMAN: And my first, even though it	
10	doesn't count, was Victor. And my second was for	
11	Orlando.	
12	DR. BAGNER: And Gilda, what about you?	
13	MS. FERRADAZ: I had Orlando and Joseph.	
14	DR. BAGNER: If you ranked them, which would you	
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16	MS. FERRADAZ: In that order.	
17	DR. BAGNER: In that order?	
18	MS. FERRADAZ: Yes.	
19	DR. BAGNER: Yes. So I think with that, I don't	
20	know if we have to vote again, because I think it	
21	would be clear that Victor would again be the leader	
22	of the votes with Mark, Mary and I all voting him as	
23	our number one choice.	
24	Any comments or objections to any of that?	
25	MS. DONWORTH: I have no objections. I think	

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1	that makes sense.	
2	MR. TROWBRIDGE: No objection. Mr. Chairman,	
3	would you like a motion to approve that	
4	recommendation so you can take it to the board?	
5	DR. BAGNER: Absolutely.	
6	MR. TROWBRIDGE: I'll make the motion that we	
7	recommend Victor Diaz-Herman to fill the vacant seat	
8	on our board of directors.	
9	MS. DONWORTH: I second it, Mary.	
10	DR. BAGNER: So the motion on the floor is	
11	recommend Victor Diaz-Herman to fill the at-large	
12	position for our board.	
13	Do we have a discussion, any comments before we	
14	vote?	
15	MR. TROWBRIDGE: I know we have a couple of	
16	board members that weren't able to join us today. I	
17	don't know if we heard from them, or any feedback	
18	from them. I assume they'll be in the board meeting,	
19	potentially.	
20	MS. DONWORTH: I mean, I just want to say this.	
21	I was really impressed with him. I thought he was	
22	extremely thoughtful. I thought the fact that he has	
23	the finance background as well, you know, it's like a	
24	two for one. I thought his answer were very, very	
25	good, very strong.	

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MR. TROWBRIDGE: I w	ould agree. And we	've be
through this now, many of us	s together, probably	three
times in the last calendar ye	ar. And very few	
referenced our strategic plar	n, asked questions a	bout
it. And I can't think of a time	where we've had	
public comments in support	of the candidates, so	o it

7 shows that people are paying attention to who is

8 applying and they want to make sure that we also vet

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would agree. And we've been

9 those processes very transparent, with transparency,

10 as I know we do, so.

11 DR. BAGNER: Yeah, thank you. I would echo

12 those comments that were just raised and add to that.

13 I think a voice of a strong advocate for LGBTQIA

14 youth is extremely important on our board. I know

15 that we do talk about important issues. I know Mark

16 is an advocate and brings those issues up, but I

17 think having such a strong advocate like Victor,

18 adding to our board, is a critically important thing

19 at this point. So I think in addition to all the

20 positive things that were stated, I think that is a

21 huge, for me, is a huge factor in ranking him in my

22 number one choice. Any other comments?

23 MR. HOFFMAN: I agree.

24 MR. TROWBRIDGE: No, I would just say, again,

25 our poll remains very deep because I think, as you

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1	see, the closest of the vote, there are one or two
2	other candidates who, if we were to have a sudden
3	other opening, would be quick to go to and keep the
4	process open and going forward, so it's great to see
5	how many folks want to serve on this board. I think
6	they see the value, also the opportunity to really
7	make a difference. So I want to thank The Trust
8	leadership and staff for that because they help carry
9	that water every day.
10	MS. FERRADAZ: Yeah, I'll just add. I really
11	liked Samuel Joseph. Loved his demeanor, loved his
12	responses. And yes, if we have other openings that
13	come up, certainly to keep him in the mix.
14	DR. BAGNER: Thank you all. Any other comments?
15	Okay, with that, all those in favor of
16	recommending Victor Diaz-Herman as our at-large
17	member?
18	ALL: Aye.
19	DR. BAGNER: Any opposed? Any recusals?
20	Motion passes unanimously. Great. Thank you
21	all for the very efficient meeting and sticking with
22	us this morning for all the interviews. With that,
23	we'll give the extra time to Muriel to shift over the
24	room.
25	MR. HOFFMAN: I want to just thank everybody for

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1	taking, this was a long day for this committee and
2	will be because of the upcoming board meeting. I
3	think that this is really important, but it is a
4	testament to your service that we're still here in
5	this afternoon and making the decision in this
6	compressed timeframe. So, thanks, everybody.
7	DR. BAGNER: Thank you, Ken.
8	With that, we'll close the meeting. Perhaps,
9	Imran, or someone, if you can help me draft really
10	quickly some talking points for the board meeting,
11	that would be great.
12	MR. HAJ: Mr. Chair, we'll get them to you
13	shortly.
14	DR. BAGNER: Wonderful. Thank you. Yeah, if we
15	could have the same as we did last time of, like, the
16	number of applications we received, the number of
17	interviews, and then a brief bio of Victor, would be
18	great.
19	And, Jim, I don't know if you were going to
20	reach out to Victor? And if you wanted me to, I'd be
21	happy to call him as well.
22	MR. HAJ: Mr. Chair, I think as soon as the
23	board meeting is over, if you would like to reach out
24	to him and I'll follow up. Let me know when you
25	speak to him and I can speak to him. And Ken as

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1	well.	
2	DR. BAGNER: Great, thank you, Jim. Yeah, if we	
3	can, along with the meeting points for the board	
4	meeting, if you can send me his phone number and I'll	
5	call him once the board meeting is over.	
6	Great. Thank you, everyone. I will see you all	
7	shortly in the next meeting.	
8	MR. TROWBRIDGE: Yeah, let's not do this again	
9	for a little bit.	
10	DR. BAGNER: That sounds good to me. Thank you	
11	all for hanging in there.	
12	MR. HOFFMAN: Take care, thanks.	
13	DR. BAGNER: Bye-bye.
