1	PROCEEDINGS
2	(Recording of the meeting began at 3:30 p.m.)
3	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Muriel, do we have any public
4	comments?
5	MS. JEANTY: No, Madam Chair, we don't have any
6	public comments.
7	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you very much. Just a
8	moment, please.
9	Let's move on to the approval of the minutes.
10	Committee members, by now you would have had an
11	opportunity to review the minutes from our October 7th
12	meeting.
13	May I have a motion to approve the minutes?
14	DR. ABRAHAM: So, moved, Abraham.
15	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. And a second?
16	MS. DONWORTH: Second, Donworth.
17	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you, Mary.
18	All those in favor of approving the minutes?
19	(WHEREUPON, the committee members all responded with
20'	aye.")
21	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Any opposed?
22	(No verbal response.)
23	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: The minutes are approved. We
24	have just three resolutions for your consideration
25	today. Let's dive in with Resolution 2022-A:

1	Authorization to execute no-cost extensions with eight
2	providers to continue their innovation projects for a
3	term of three to six months, commencing January 1,
4	2022, and ending no later than June 30, 2022.
5	May I have a motion, please?
6	DR. ABRAHAM: So, moved, Abraham.
7	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. And a second?
8	DR. BAGNER: Second, Bagner.
9	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you, Dan.
10	Are there any recusals?
11	(No verbal response.)
12	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: That's right, I was told
13	there were no recusals today. And moving into
14	discussion. Committee members, last October 2020, the
15	Trust Board approved contracts with 22 organizations
16	to implement innovative projects and/or test new ideas
17	that addressed an existing community need. These
18	projects were intended to plan a pilot and innovative
19	concept of practice that impacts families with
20	children within Miami-Dade County. Eight of the 22
21	organizations have requested a no-cost extension past
22	the original 12-month contract period. And it should
23	be noted that innovation projects often require
24	additional time due to unexpected challenges or
25	delays. And this was especially evident this round

1	due to the pandemic. And the eight providers that
2	requested extensions were mainly due to the program
3	delays relating to COVID, as they interact closely
4	with children or operate inside of a school setting.
5	Moving into discussion, observations, questions
6	from the Committee?
7	(No verbal response.)
8	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Hearing none, all those in
9	favor?
10	(WHEREUPON, the committee members all responded with
11'	aye.")
12	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Are there any opposed?
13	(No verbal response.)
14	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Hearing none, Resolution
15	2022-A carries.
16	Moving on to Resolution 2022-B: Authorization to
17	release competitive solicitations, in alignment with
18	the board's strategic priorities and projected
19	available funding, across multiple investment areas
20	that have funding cycles ending with the 2021-2022
21	fiscal year.
22	May I have a motion, please?
23	MS. WELLER: So, moved, Weller.
24	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. And a second?
25	DR. BAGNER: Second, Bagner.

1	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. Are there any
2	recusals?
3	(No verbal response.)
4	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: No recusals. Let's move into
5	discussion for this resolution. A little bit of
6	background, this resolution seeks authorization to
7	release the three competitor solicitations that are
8	due out in the coming year. In alignment with Board
9	priorities discussed throughout last year's budgeting
10	process, these release amounts include an additional
11	\$4,000,000.00 for family and neighborhood support
12	partnerships to serve more populations in need at a
13	total of 13.5 million. Also, the Board's prioritized
14	investment of 1,000,000.00 to expand Trust provider's,
15	staff board and community professional development
16	supports regarding mental health, trauma, and Social
17	and Emotional Wellness, that's SEW, in Racial Equity,
18	Diversity, and Inclusion, that's REDI, will be
19	included in the Trust academy quality supports
20	solicitation, which will put out a total of 3.4
21	million. And finally, we will release our innovation
22	funding again this year at its annual amount of
23	\$1,000,000.00. Once applications are received and
24	reviewed, funding recommendations for each of these
25	solicitations will come back to the Board for approval

1	next June.
2	Observations, questions from the Committee?
3	MS. DONWORTH: I just want to say that I think
4	it's phenomenal that the Trust puts resources into
5	these types of things, particularly the innovation
6	fund. I think it's a wonderful thing for the
7	community.
8	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you, Mary. And many of
9	us had an opportunity to participate in the summit for
10	the Early Childhood Innovation Project. And I think
11	we were suitably wowed this afternoon.
12	Jim, do I see you?
13	MR. HAJ: I just want to piggyback on Mary's
14	comments. We only have three resos that are going to
15	the November Board. We're taking the opportunity of
16	bringing seven of the innovation fund recipients to
17	present to the Board brief presentations. But it is -
18	- I thank the Board for creating this innovation fund.
19	There's some really great stuff going on in this
20	community and people thinking outside the box. In
21	November Board meeting, you'll be able to see seven in
22	person of them represented to us.
23	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you, Jim.
24	Further input from the Committee?
25	(No verbal response.)

1	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Hearing none, all those in
2	favor?
3	(WHEREUPON, the committee members all responded with
4 "	aye.")
5	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Are there any opposed?
6	FEMALE VOICE: Aye.
7	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: The resolution carries.
8	And our final resolution for this meeting,
9	Resolution 2022-C: Motion to recommend the resolution
10	to the Board of Directors on November 15, 2021, was
11	made by Dr. Edward Abraham and seconded by Dr. Daniel
12	Bagner. Motion passed unanimously.
13	May I have a motion, please?
14	DR. BAGNER: So, moved, Bagner.
15	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. And a second?
16	MS. WELLER: Second, Weller.
17	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. Any recusals?
18	(No verbal response.)
19	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: I understand there are none
20	on this resolution. And as we move into discussion,
21	for more than five years, the Trust has partnered with
22	several major early childhood systems partners,
23	including the Early Learning Coalition, County Head
24	Start Office, and the school system's Early Childhood
25	Division to integrate data to learn about the needs of

1	young children and to improve our services across
2	systems. The Miami-Dade IDEAS Consortium for Children
3	is due to update our formal data collaboration sharing
4	agreement and the resolution before you seeks
5	Committee, then Board authorization with the Trust to
6	sign the agreement to continue this partnership. The
7	University of Miami serves as the neutral entity that
8	receives and integrates data from different parties
9	and identifies the integrated data for use in specific
10	collaboratively agreed upon research projects
11	established through data use license agreements.
12	Recently, the IDEAS Consortium has received several
13	local and national grants that will utilize the
14	integrated data partnership, include from the Robert
15	Wood Foundation and the Spencer Foundation, as well as
16	one of the newly funded Trust early childhood
17	community research grants.
18	Feedback, observations from the Committee?
19	MR. DIAZ-HERMAN: I just have a question. What
20	is the organization or unit the University of Miami
21	that this is working through? Is it the Department of
22	Pediatrics or is it some other? Just the connection.
23	DR. HANSON: It's the Department of Psychology.
24	MR. DIAZ-HERMAN: Psychology.
25	DR. HANSON: They work with the computer science

1	the Center for Computational Science.
2	MR. DIAZ-HERMAN: Okay.
3	DR. HANSON: Does the actual computer work, the
4	combining of the data.
5	MR. DIAZ-HERMAN: Yeah. Because, you know,
6	handling these big data sets is really important to
7	just yeah, they certainly have the expertise.
8	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. Thank you, Lori.
9	DR. BAGNER: If I may? This is just a quick
10	follow up. So, I know that there's no budget impact,
11	so the funding is all through, it sounds like Robert
12	Wood Johnson and other foundations like that, that
13	handle the cost of this?
14	DR. HANSON: So, there is some infrastructure
15	funding for the integrated data system that the Trust
16	has, is part it usually comes to you as part of the
17	IT resolution, all of our different systems funding.
18	That's about \$150,000.00 a year that the Trust
19	supports. And then, yes, the specific projects are
20	funded through these other sources. So, part of what
21	we fund is coordination, getting the partners
22	together, having a governance committee running. And
23	then together we put together proposals and apply for
24	other funding to do specific projects that happen
25	under a data use license agreement that's approved by

1 each partner. 2 MR. DIAZ-HERMAN: And you mentioned that the 3 Robert Wood Johnson Foundation was involved in this. What is their role? That's terrific. It's somewhat 4 5 unusual. 6 DR. HANSON: They have -- I think we have someone 7 on the call from UM that could tell the exact 8 initiative, but it's their equity policy initiative 9 that recently came out, that we were invited to 10 propose, and then we were rewarded. 11 MR. DIAZ-HERMAN: Okay, great. 12 MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you. Anything else from our Committee? 13 14 (No verbal response.) 15 MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: With that, all those in 16 favor? 17 (WHEREUPON, the committee members all responded with 18 laye.") 19 MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Are there any opposed? 20 (No verbal response.) 21 MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: This resolution also carries. 22 That concludes our resolutions for this afternoon. 23 Punting to you, Jim. 24 MR. HAJ: Madam Chair, thank you. 25 Earlier today many of the Board members here

spent three hours for the early childhood research
demonstration grant. We will bring some updates at
the Board meeting. But I think this is something that
this Board, during our Early Childhood Ad Hoc five
years ago, this was a priority. And this was the
culminating event for the four year, the first cohort
wrapping it up and presenting to us. I think those
who are here today were pretty impressed with the
outcomes and the research being done. What we're
learning locally and how to be shared with others
locally and nationally. So, I think it's some great
work. This Board should be exceptionally proud of
that. Piggybacking on this, November 9, which is next
Tuesday, from 9:00 to 12:00, I encourage you, if you
can, to attend the Early Childhood Ad Hoc Board
meeting. We have presented from the national, the
state level business community, and all of our local
partners will be here. It's a great way to talk to
early childcare has always been important to us. It's
always been somewhat a fragile environment. COVID
just tore the early childcare system apart. We were a
great part of keeping it together in Miami-Dade and I
think the research shows that Miami-Dade was in much
better shape than the rest of the state because of the
Trust investments. So, we're going to highlight some

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1 of that on Tuesday. But just to hear the discussion 2 and work with other partners, talking about early 3 childcare, the importance of early childcare. 4 Bringing you an update of where we've come in the last 5 five years and where we're going. So, if you can be 6 with us in-person or virtually, we'd greatly 7 appreciate it. And we're going to have the Racial, 8 Equity, and Social Justice Sunshine meeting on 9 December 2nd from 3:30 to 5:30. And there's going to 10 be a Board meeting this month. Again, we have three 11 resos we're going to bring in innovation funds. 12 There's no Board meeting in November, I mean in 13 December. And then we'll reconvene back in January. 14 Thank you, Madam Chair. 15 MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you, Jim. 16 DR. BENDROSS-MINDINGALL: Madam Chair? 17 MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Yes, we can hear you. 18 DR. BENDROSS-MINDINGALL: Okay, wonderful. Thank 19 you. I want to reiterate a part of what Jim said 20 about the, I would call it a workshop, this afternoon, 21 I was on. I'm just very pleased with the comments and 22 of course the research done on parental engagement, 23 and of course mental and emotional health. I 24 appreciate all that we do for that because many of our

children, as you know, have a lot that they go

1	through. And of course, the sooner we recognize, we
2	can probably prevent it ongoing as they mature. Thank
3	you again. And I truly enjoyed it this afternoon.
4	Thank you, Madam Chair.
5	MS. HOLLINGSWORTH: Thank you, Doctor Bendross-
6	Mindingall.
7	And with that, committee members, I'll close in
8	saying that I look forward in seeing all of you at the
9	two Ad Hoc Committee meetings that Jim just described.
10	And with that, we stand adjourned. Thank you very
11	much.
