1 PROCEEDINGS

2 (Recording of the meeting began at 3:32
3 p.m.)

4 MS. WELLER: Good afternoon, everyone, and
5 welcome to the Program Services and Childhood Health
6 Committee meeting. We'll go ahead and get started.

7 Do we have any public comments?

8 MS. JEANTY: No public comments.

9 MS. WELLER: No public comments, okay. All
10 right. Then we'll just go ahead and move along.
11 Everyone should have had an opportunity to review the
12 minutes from January 10th of the Program Services
13 Committee meeting.

14 Can I get a motion for acceptance of the
15 minutes?

16 MR. BRANDON: So moved, Brandon.

17 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Second?

18 DR. LAWThER: Second, Lawther.

19 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Okay. So, we'll go
20 ahead and move into our resolutions. Oh, I'm sorry.
21 All those in favor?

22 (WHEREUPON, the Board members all responded
23 with "aye".)

24 MS. WELLER: Opposed?

25 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

1 MS. WELLER: Okay. The minutes are passed.
2 All right. So, we'll go ahead and go into our
3 resolutions for this afternoon. The first resolution is
4 Resolution 2019-A, authorization to negotiate and
5 execute contracts with the University of Miami, Be
6 Strong International, Inc., and Florida International
7 University, to deliver brief parenting workshops,
8 educational or public health events, in a total amount
9 not to exceed \$1,295,868.00, for an initial term of 17
10 months, commencing March 1st, 2019 and ending July 31st,
11 2020, with three remaining 12-month renewals, subject to
12 annual funding appropriations.

13 May I have a motion?

14 MS. DONWORTH: So moved, Donworth.

15 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Second?

16 DR. LAWATHER: Second, Lawther.

17 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Any recusals?

18 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

19 MS. WELLER: Any discussion?

20 MS. DONWORTH: I have a question. How do
21 parents access this? Is it broadly advertised and then
22 is it in, you know, like, a workshop or fair setting?

23 MS. WELLER: Okay. Can someone -- Lori?

24 DR. HANSON: Lori Hanson with the Children's
25 Trust. This is a brand-new piece to our parenting

1 investments. So, our intention is to launch this as
2 countywide workshops that are available, to market it
3 together, to have consistency across what's being
4 offered.

5 So, the Trust is going to be involved in a
6 lot of that promotion and marketing in partnership, of
7 course, with the selected entities. And so we'll be
8 coordinating with them together.

9 It's a little bit different than in our
10 larger parenting portfolio where you have many groups
11 and home visitation programs, you know, 30 or 40
12 different programs. They go out. They brand
13 themselves. They're noted as part of the Children's
14 Trust.

15 This is, in a way, think about it kind of
16 like our book club. We want to have it be parenting,
17 supports across the community from the Children's Trust.
18 So, it's to be determined to the exact answer to your
19 question, because we are just starting -- we are just
20 starting this endeavor.

21 And we want to introduce it to our website
22 with the adoption of our parent app. So, all of those
23 things are sort of universal resources for all parents
24 in the County.

25 MR. BRANDON: So, does this look like you'll

1 be going into the community with workshops in public
2 facilities, public spaces, or will it be coming to the
3 University of Miami?

4 DR. HANSON: No. All of the proposals
5 proposed community-based site locations. Some of them
6 have partnerships with the school district. Some of
7 them have partnerships with some Head Start centers,
8 different neighborhood locations. So, definitely in the
9 communities is where it would be. Is there another part
10 of your question?

11 MR. BRANDON: No, that's fine.

12 MS. DONWORTH: And then how is the
13 effectiveness going to be tracked?

14 DR. HANSON: Well, the main effectiveness
15 here, because it's a universal sort of very light touch,
16 you know, one-off workshops, will be reached, right? We
17 want to really reach as many parents as possible.

18 One of the required activities that all of
19 the people that are providing workshops is that it
20 includes connecting those parents to linger after and
21 maybe, you know, indicate that they have more needs or
22 more interests, being able to connect those parents to
23 the network of other services that the Children's Trust
24 offers through all of our other provider networks.

25 So, we will be tracking, you know, how many

1 of those referrals were made to other programs, and so
2 that's the kind of thing that we're looking at, you
3 know. We may be able to have some measures of increased
4 knowledge, awareness of different points that parents
5 should know about for child development or parenting
6 skills. But we're not accepting, you know, child
7 outcomes from the workshops series.

8 MS. WELLER: Any other questions?

9 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

10 MS. WELLER: All those in favor?

11 (WHEREUPON, the Board members all responded
12 with "aye".)

13 MS. WELLER: Opposed?

14 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

15 MS. WELLER: The motion carries.

16 Resolution 2019-B, authorization to negotiate and
17 execute a contract with Florida International University
18 Board of Trustees to provide reading enhancement
19 services, in a total amount not to exceed \$882,168.00
20 for a term of 12 months commencing October 1st, 2019 and
21 ending September 30th, 2020, with four remaining
22 12-month renewals, subject to annual funding
23 appropriations.

24 May I have a motion?

25 MR. BRANDON: So moved, Brandon.

1 MS. DONWORTH: Second, Donworth.

2 MS. WELLER: Okay. Any recusals?

3 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

4 MS. WELLER: Discussion, questions?

5 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

6 MS. WELLER: Okay. All those in favor?

7 (WHEREUPON, the Board members all responded
8 with "aye".)

9 MS. WELLER: Opposed?

10 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

11 MS. WELLER: The motion carries.

12 Resolution 2019-C, authorization to negotiate and
13 execute contracts with eight providers, identified
14 herein, to provide early intervention summer camp
15 services for children birth to five years of age, in a
16 total amount not to exceed \$2,217,499.00 for a term of
17 six months, commencing March 1st, 2019 and ending August
18 31st, 2019, with four remaining six month renewals, in a
19 total annual amount not to exceed \$2,217,499.00, subject
20 to annual funding appropriations.

21 May I have a motion?

22 MS. DONWORTH: So moved, Donworth.

23 MR. BRANDON: Second, Brandon.

24 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Any recusals?

25 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

1 MS. WELLER: Okay. Any discussion,
2 questions?

3 MR. BRANDON: With all of these programs
4 that we have like this one, I'm always concerned about
5 people getting access -- proper access -- people in
6 under-served areas.

7 And I know we do a good job in dealing with
8 that. But I just want to make sure that folks that
9 really need this, they're able to get -- there are
10 multiple ways to get out and get the word out rather
11 than just on-line and through -- an easy way to get
12 information out.

13 So, just out of curiosity, how do we get the
14 word out to folks in this community?

15 MS. SPECTOR: Rachel Spector with the
16 Children's Trust. So, the majority of the children that
17 participate in these summer programs are receiving
18 school-year services and then they don't qualify for
19 summer services. It's not funded through the State.

20 Then they transition into various summer
21 programs. And then for other children --

22 MR. BRANDON: When you say "transition," is
23 it from their program at school?

24 MS. SPECTOR: It could be, yeah, from the
25 school year. I mean, many of these same providers offer

1 a school-year program and then they remain through our
2 funding for the summer because it wouldn't otherwise be
3 funded in the summer.

4 But for some of the programs that don't
5 offer a school-year program, they recruit from nearby
6 schools for the children that are receiving school-year
7 services and then also from the communities.

8 For example, FIU has one site in Liberty
9 City, being over-crowded in public schools, so then they
10 serve the children regularly during the school year and
11 then also recruit them throughout the neighborhood. And
12 we have sites from Florida City, Homestead, all the way
13 through to Miami Gardens and many neighborhoods.

14 DR. HANSON: And just to add onto that, Lori
15 Hanson here again, last year, in this initiative, 69
16 percent of the participating children lived in
17 high-poverty neighborhoods.

18 MR. BRANDON: Okay, beautiful.

19 MS. WELLER: Any other questions,
20 discussion?

21 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

22 MS. WELLER: Okay. All those in favor?

23 (WHEREUPON, the Board members all responded
24 with "aye".)

25 MS. WELLER: Opposed?

1 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

2 MS. WELLER: The motion carries.

3 Resolution 2019-D, authorization to negotiate and
4 execute contracts with 18 small community-based
5 organizations identified herein, for the first year of a
6 two-year capacity-building initiative, in a total amount
7 not to exceed \$585,000.00 for a term of 12 months,
8 commencing April 1st, 2019 and ending March 31st, 2020,
9 with one 12-month renewal, subject to annual funding
10 appropriations.

11 May I have a motion?

12 MR. BRANDON: So moved, Brandon.

13 MS. DONWORTH: Second, Donworth.

14 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Any recusals?

15 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

16 MS. WELLER: Discussion?

17 MS. DONWORTH: I just have a comment. I
18 just want to compliment the Trust staff on the design of
19 the initiative. I think it's very exciting and I'm
20 thrilled that you're doing this.

21 MR. BRANDON: I know this was discussed
22 before, but what determines the level of funding?

23 MS. SYLVESTRE: From the first two tiers
24 includes both revenue and in-kind, and the third tier
25 includes just revenue. So, we have three different

1 tiers, and it's twenty thousand, thirty five thousand
2 and fifty thousand, depending on your overall budget.

3 MR. BRANDON: Okay. I remember talking
4 about it. Thank you for reminding me.

5 DR. LAWTHER: And I have a question. The
6 full Board passed an item last time with respect to
7 Catalyst. Is this the implementation of that?

8 MS. SYLVESTRE: Yes.

9 MS. WELLER: Okay. Any other questions?

10 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

11 MS. WELLER: Okay. All those in favor?

12 (WHEREUPON, the Board members all responded
13 with "aye".)

14 MS. WELLER: Opposed?

15 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

16 MS. WELLER: The motion carries.

17 Resolution 2019-E, authorization to negotiate and
18 execute contract amendments to extend three Funder
19 Collaboration contracts with Miami Homes for All, Inc.,
20 Hosanna Community Foundation and Big Brothers Big
21 Sisters of Greater Miami, Inc., through September 30th,
22 2019, and to increase funding to correspond with the
23 additional months of service, to align the contracts
24 with the fiscal year beginning on October 1st, 2019, in
25 a total amount not to exceed \$112,500.00.

1 May I have a motion?

2 PASTOR DUNN: So moved, Richard Dunn.

3 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Second?

4 MS. DONWORTH: Second, Donworth.

5 MS. WELLER: Thank you. Any recusals?

6 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

7 MS. WELLER: Discussion?

8 DR. LAWATHER: Question. Does the original
9 funding come from the State?

10 MS. SYLVESTRE: No. These funding come from
11 various other foundations. The Big Brothers Big Sisters
12 comes from other donors in the community to make up the
13 match funding.

14 Hosanna, the bulk of the money comes from
15 the Annie Casey Foundation. And Homes for All has a
16 number of other local entities that are funding this
17 effort, including the Homeless Trust.

18 DR. LAWATHER: Thank you.

19 MS. WELLER: Any other questions?

20 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

21 MS. WELLER: All those in favor?

22 (WHEREUPON, the Board members all responded
23 with "aye".)

24 MS. WELLER: Opposed?

25 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

1 MS. WELLER: The motion carries.
2 Resolution 2019-F, authorization to negotiate and
3 execute a contract amendment with the Institute for
4 Child and Family Health, for additional Family
5 Strengthening services, in a total amount not to exceed
6 \$87,000.00, commencing August 1st, 2018 and ending July
7 31st, 2019, in a new total amount not to exceed
8 \$259,042.00.

9 May I have a motion?

10 MR. BRANDON: So moved, Brandon.

11 MS. WELLER: Second?

12 MS. DONWORTH: Second, Donworth.

13 MS. WELLER: Any recusals?

14 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

15 MS. WELLER: Discussion?

16 MS. SYLVESTRE: So, just as a point of
17 clarification, ICFH, when we brought this reso for
18 renewal, we were having some performance concerns, so we
19 reduced their funding amount and targeted amount of
20 clients served.

21 We then did a review of their progress and
22 we felt that they were making sufficient progress that
23 we could restore some of the funding and add additional
24 families to be served.

25 And we expect that when we bring the entire

1 portfolio back for renewal, that we will restore their
2 funding back to the original amount that they were
3 originally awarded. So, this is just part of our
4 process of, we had some concerns, worked closely with
5 the agency and then being able to be comfortable with
6 the progress that the agency has made in ensuring that
7 they're meeting the targeted number of clients served.

8 MS. WELLER: Okay. Any other questions?

9 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

10 MS. WELLER: All those in favor?

11 (WHEREUPON, the Board members all responded
12 with "aye".)

13 MS. WELLER: Opposed?

14 (NO VERBAL RESPONSE.)

15 MS. WELLER: The motion carries. These are
16 all the resolutions for today. Imran, do you have the
17 CEO report?

18 MR. ALI: Yes. Nothing too much, but just a
19 reminder about the Black History Tour next Friday from
20 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. I know some of you may have
21 responded to join us, so I'd encourage those of you who
22 have not, please RSVP. You'll benefit a great deal from
23 the site visits and learning a lot about Miami.

24 So, that's all I have to report. Further
25 questions or clarification, let me know. Thank you.

1 MS. WELLER: Okay. Our next committee
2 meeting will be Thursday, March the 7th. And I think
3 this is the shortest Program Committee meeting. But I
4 thank everybody for being here today, and I will see you
5 next month, or some of us at the Board meeting. Thank
6 you.
